Ethics is a branch of philosophy dealing with values relating to human conduct, with respect to the rightness and goodness or wickedness(bad) of certain actions. It is concerned with 'right and wrong', 'good and bad', although agreeing what is 'right' or 'good' can be challenging. An understanding of ethics is essential to the delivery of skilled professional care. It is vital that nurses appreciate the value of ethics in their work. Ethics is relevant to clinical, practice-based issues and affects all areas of the professional nursing role. To practice in an ethically sensitive way, nurses must develop reasoning skills and understand the concepts and principles that assist ethical analysis.

Identifying good practice demands a well-reasoned assessment of what nurses do conjoined with an appreciation of how and why they do it. Ethics enables the critical evaluation of nursing decisions and actions. Nursing itself is an ethical activity because its primary aims are to do good and wherever possible, avoid harm – although achieving these aims can be problematic.

Despite an increased focus on ethics in pre and post-registration nursing education, some nurses still perceive ethics as being remote from the day-to-day realities of their role. This colloquium addresses the gap in embedding nursing practices in quality health care.

Dr. BERT GORDIJN

Dr. Bert Gordijn is a Professor and Director of the Institute of Ethics at Dublin City University in Ireland. In 1995 he was awarded a doctorate in Philosophy from the Albert Ludwigs University Freiburg, followed by a doctorate in Bioethics from the Radboud University Nijmegen in 2003. He has been a Visiting Professor at Lancaster University (UK), Georgetown University (USA), the National University of Singapore and the Fondation Brocher (Switzerland). He has served on Advisory Panels and Expert Committees of the European Chemical Industry Council, the European Patent Organisation, the Irish Department of Health and UNESCO.



Dr. P ANNE SCOTT

Dr. Anne Scott is a Professor and Vice President for Equality and Diversity National University of Ireland, Galway. In 1993 she was awarded a doctorate in Philosophy from the University of Glasgow. She completed M.Sc. in Nursing Education from the University of Edinburgh in 1987. She holds Editorial Board membership for many journals. She is currently involved in research on philosophy and ethics of healthcare in clinical judgment and decision making. Prof Scott has held a number of senior leadership roles in universities in Scotland, England and Ireland, including Head of School, Executive Dean, Deputy President and Registrar.
