1. Adoption of agenda

The agenda was adopted subject to the inclusion of one additional submission under Item 5.1, eight additional submissions under Item 5.2, one additional submission under Item 6.2 and one submission under Item 12.

2. Minutes of the meeting of 3 June 2004

Confirmed and signed by the Chairperson.

3. Matters arising from the minutes

- **3.1** Follow-up actions from the last meeting were reported.
- **3.2** <u>Noted</u> that the proposal on procedures to be adopted when teaching family members or other people in relation to whom a conflict of interest might arise had been discussed by Academic Council at its meeting of 9 June 2004. It is now to be discussed by Executive and, subsequently, by Academic Council again. (Item 3.4)
- **3.3** <u>Noted</u> that discussions were ongoing with the Research Advisory Panel about possible interruptions to funding in cases where research students interrupt their studies. (Item 3.5)

- **3.4** <u>Noted</u> that, while a suggestion had been made by the Programme Board for the BA in Journalism that the Department of Education and Science might be approached for information on the standards of written English of students who obtain a higher-level honours grade in the subject, no approach had in fact been made. (Item 4.4)
- **3.5** <u>Noted</u> that the possibility of using videoconferencing for *viva voce* examinations was one that would require detailed debate and that an initial discussion might take place at a future meeting of Standing Committee. (Item 5.2.1)
- **3.6** <u>Agreed</u> that the Registry would be requested to analyse recent cases in which members of staff had presented for examination for research degrees, thereby necessitating the appointment of two external examiners rather than one, with a view to establishing whether or not it would be possible to consider introducing some flexibility with regard to the number of external examiners required in such situations. (Item 5.2.1)
- **3.7** <u>Noted</u> that the full *curriculum vitae* requested in respect of a nominated external examiner had been submitted. The nomination was therefore <u>approved</u>. (Item 5.2.4)
- **3.8** *Noted* that the PGR9 form (Application for Direct Entry to the PhD Register) had been revised slightly and that it was intended that a similar form would be devised to cater for applications for direct entry to Master's degrees by research. (Item 6)
- **3.9** <u>Agreed</u> that, where an applicant for direct entry to the PhD register is adequately qualified at Master's level, no account needs to be taken of his/her qualifications at primary degree level and therefore no request needs to be made to Standing Committee to consider the application on an exceptional basis. Item 2.6 of *Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research and Thesis* will be revised accordingly. (Item 6.5.2)
- **3.10** <u>Noted</u> that the revised proposal on notional learning time within modules would be discussed by Standing Committee at a future date. (Item 13)
