MINUTES

THURSDAY, 1 February 2001
AT 9:00 AM IN EXECUTIVE MEETING ROOM

Prefatory Remarks: The Chairperson opened the meeting by welcoming the newly elected members of the Standing Committee of Academic Council. She briefly outlined the roles and functions of the Committee, which are summarised in a document that she distributed to its members.

1. Adoption of agenda

The agenda was adopted, subject to the inclusion of two additional items tabled by the Chairperson and Hugo Brady under AOB.

2. Minutes of meeting of 7 December 2000

The minutes of the meeting of 7 December 2000 were adopted and signed by the Chairperson.

3. Matters arising from the minutes

Follow-up actions arising from the minutes were reported by the Chairman, the key items being:

3.1 Draft Guidelines for co-ordination of assessments and projects and on retention and disposal of examination scripts

The Chairperson presented revised drafts to the meeting, which incorporated a number of revisions suggested by the Teaching and Learning Committee. Members of Standing Committee suggested additional amendments. The documents, including these latest revisions, will now be passed to Academic Council

3.2 Termination of MCAE Programme

The Chairperson reported on the background to this development. Due to falling numbers, a trend which is unlikely to be reversed, the School of Computer Applications has decided to terminate this programme with effect from the beginning of the next academic year. As the course has already been advertised in the Faculty booklet, any applicants who apply will be offered the opportunity to register for the Grad Dip/MSc in Computer Applications.

3.3 Guidelines for Minute Writing

The Chairperson presented draft guidelines on minute writing for discussion by Standing Committee. The Guidelines were adopted with some minor amendments. The document will now be passed to Academic Council. The issue of whether the Registry should provide a template for minute writing was raised. It was agreed that the Chairperson should explore this issue further, when the document is discussed at Academic Council.

3.4 Grad Dip/MA in School Chaplaincy/Pastoral Care

The Chairperson reported that a formal request from Mater Dei to upgrade the Grad Dip in School Chaplaincy/Pastoral Care programme to a Masters degree with the addition of a dissertation module with supporting research methodology had been received. The original Accreditation Board had recommended this development. The proposal, with supporting documentation, had been sent to all members of the Accreditation Board and responses had been received from all. The unanimous recommendation to Academic Council was to approve the proposed change. The documentation was considered and it was agreed to pass this recommendation to Academic Council.

3.5 Diploma in Nursing (Registered Mental Handicap Nurse)

The Chairperson reported that she had informed the Programme Board of Standing Committee's concern about the use of the term 'mental handicap' in a DCU programme title. The Programme Board agreed with these sentiments. However, because of the current link with Bord Altranais's formally registered description 'mental handicap', a unilateral change by DCU would be difficult. In the light of the fact that the diploma is being phased out and that the proposed nursing degree will refer to 'intellectual disability', it was agreed that it would not be appropriate to change the diploma nomenclature.

It was agreed that *item 6.1* should be discussed with the Examinations Officer to look at administrative implications. Standing Committee also agreed that the Programme Board could not proceed with interviewing a student for direct entry into programme outside the normal CAO channels (*item 6.2*).

- 4.6 Programme Board: BSc in Sport Science & Health, 08/11/00. Noted. Registrar to check with Board that the ‘second substitute paper’ should in fact read ‘assessment’ (*item 8.2*). Registrar will propose AC’s advice that the phrase ‘and seek permission to do so’ should be omitted from *item 8.3* (bullet 1 and 2). The Registrar will also seek from the Board a position paper setting out some more detail of their intentions and aims in any projected scheme for reserving places for outstanding athletes and how they would propose to deal with the issues of equity between students (*item 9*).
