- **3.6** It was <u>noted</u>, in relation to Item 4.7, that the Programme Chair for the BA in Accounting and Finance had confirmed that the preparation/interview skills workshops were neither credit-bearing nor compulsory.
- **3.7** It was <u>noted</u>, in relation to Item 8, that the Validation Committee had approved the proposal to have the *curricula vitae* of proposed accreditation panel members approved by Standing Committee as a matter of course, and that the guidelines for accreditation were being amended to this effect.

Standing Committee recognised the special need of this programme to convene a Progression Board at the end of each year in the light of the 'personal readiness' requirement for progression. However, it should be discussed and decided by a full Progression and Awards Board including external examiners, and not, as suggested, by the Chairman in consultation with others. It was <u>agreed</u> that the Registrar would present to the meeting of Standing Committee of 4 July 2002 a general proposal to allow derogations in similar circumstances, i.e. where a Progression Board needed to be convened (even if no awards were being made) to determine students' suitability, in terms of personal readiness, to progress to the following year of the programme.

With regard to the request, in Item 6.1, for approval for a mechanism to recognise prior learning for applicants to the Graduate Diploma, Standing Committee <u>agreed</u> to ask the Programme Chair to resubmit the request for consideration at its meeting of 4 July 2002. The resubmitted request should include reference to the mechanisms for identifying the precise reasons for which exemptions are sought and the modules from which exemption is sought, as well as the steps to be taken by applicants to fulfil any outstanding requirements. The resubmitted request should also include the process whereby all past graduates are to be contacted, as well as details of the costs involved in assessing applicants' suitability. It was <u>agreed</u> that, if approved, the mechanism for recognising prior learning should operate for two future intakes on to the Graduate Diploma.
