- **3.4** The Programme Chair for the BSc in Sport Science and Health has been requested to conduct a review of the revised academic structure before the end of the academic year 2002-03. The outcome of the review, which should incorporate the views of all the members of the Programme Board and the external examiners, should be communicated to Standing Committee. (Item 7)
