1. Adoption of agenda

The agenda was adopted subject to the inclusion of one additional submission under Item 5.1, two additional submissions under Item 5.2, one additional submission under Item 6, one additional submission under Item 6.2 and one submission under Item 9.

2. Minutes of the meeting of 13 January 2005

Confirmed and signed by the Chairperson.

3. Matters arising from the minutes

3.1 Follow-up actions from the last meeting were reported.

3.2 Noted that contact had been made with the working group set up by Executive to look at conflict of interest issues across the University, and that the work of this group was progressing. (Item 3.4)

3.3 Noted that the Irish Universities Quality Board publication entitled *Good Practice in the Organisation of PhD Programmes in Irish Universities* was now available and that it indicated support for the use of practices such as videoconferencing at *viva voce* examinations provided appropriate procedures governed such use.

- Agreed that draft guidelines on the use of videoconferencing in this way, which would be informed by recent experience in three Schools as well as the advice of Mr Mac Conmara on technical and security issues, would be submitted to the 3 March 2005 meeting of Standing Committee. (Item 3.5)
- 3.4 Noted that the Registry would, as soon as possible, devise a form to cater for applications for direct entry to Master's degrees by research. (Item 3.6)
- 3.5 Noted that the issue of notional learning time within modules would be discussed by the Working Group on Modularisation. (Item 3.7)
- 3.6 Noted that it had been agreed between the Registry and the Faculties that responsibility for paying external examiners should remain with the Registry. (Item 3.8)
- 3.7 Agreed that the issue of frequency of appointment of external examiners within a given time period would be discussed at a meeting to be organised shortly for interested parties to discuss a range of matters pertaining to postgraduate research. (Item 3.9)
- 3.8 Noted that difficulties still remained for some staff with regard to the electronic completion of forms for submission to the Registry and, from there, Standing Committee and that this matter would be investigated further by the Registry. (Item 3.10)
- 3.9 Agreed that the desirability or otherwise of permitting direct entry to the PhD register for candidates holding a taught Master's degree would be discussed at the meeting referred to at 3.7 above. (Item 3.11)
- 3.10 Noted that clarification was awaited as to whether or not a proposed additional supervisor had been advised that the proposal had been made. (Item 3.12)
- 3.11 Noted that the Registry was considering the option of removing the heading 'For Office Use Only' from the PGR9 (request for direct entry to the PhD register) form to make it easier to complete. (Item 3.14)
- 3.12 Noted that, once the regulations on frequency of appointment of external examiners (see 3.7 above) had been agreed and if it were necessary on the basis of these regulations to distinguish between Master's and PhD supervision, the Registry would be requested to specify, on nomination forms, whether previous work carried out by external examiners related to Master's or PhD students or both. (Item 3.16)

- 3.13 Noted that the proposed amendments to sections 5.2, 12.1 and 12.3 of *Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research and Thesis*, approved by Standing Committee at its meeting of 13 January 2005, would be submitted for approval to the 16 February 2005 meeting of Academic Council. (Item 3.17)
- 3.14 Noted that the Registry would shortly send a request to those responsible for submitting forms to do so in a timely fashion. (Item 3.19)
- 3.15 Noted that a policy on APL would be drafted once a member of staff with appropriate expertise could be sourced to carry out this work. (Items 4.12 and 9)
- 3.16 Noted that a nomination for an additional external examiner in respect of a research student was awaited from a School. (Item 5.2.2)
- 3.17 Agreed that the issue of appropriate workloads for supervisors of research students would be discussed at the meeting referred to at 3.7 above. (Item 5)
