6. POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH STUDENT ADMINISTRATION:

APPLICATIONS & REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

(ref. AC-SC99/M3/6)

- The Registrar advised the meeting that Section 3 of the current academic regulations for postgraduate degrees by research and submission of a thesis deals with application and registration procedures which, *inter alia*, requires formal communication from the Research Committee (with its recommendations on student applications) to Academic Council for confirmation.
- He proposed an amendment to the regulations which would require a summary of all postgraduate research applications to be noted by Standing Committee of Academic Council (on a periodic basis) and would only refer to the Research Committee those applications where questions are raised regarding the adequacy and/or good standing of applicant qualifications etc.
- Standing Committee was presented with the relevant extract from the current regulations together with the proposed wording for an amendment to this particular extract.
- Standing Committee <u>approved</u> the proposed amendment to the regulations and, in recognition that other sections of the regulations will also need to be revised (e.g. updating of nomenclature), it recommended that a revised document be submitted to Academic Council for formal approval.
- Responding to concerns raised by Standing Committee regarding other aspects of research student administration, the Chairperson agreed to return to a future meeting with some proposals.

b. BEd Degree: Amendments to Marks & Standards

(ref. AC-SC99/M3/7.3)

Standing Committee <u>approved</u> a number of amendments to the *Marks & Standards* for the Education course on the BEd degree programme, effective from the 1999/2000 academic year. The changes were in two broad categories: (i) grouping of cognate courses into pass/fail units; (ii) a stipulation that performance in Teaching Practice be satisfactory in Year 1; and the final result of Teaching Practice to comprise a weighting which accords 33¹/₃% to Year 2 and 66²/₃% to Year 3.
