Dublin City University invites applications from Indian students for a PhD studentship in Humanities and Social Sciences, valued at between €21,000 and €27,000 pa, for up to four years.

This scholarship is supported by Dublin City University's Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in conjunction with DCU's *Ireland India Institute*, which is a knowledge exchange institute designed to foster contacts and understanding between India and Ireland, based on building links between DCU and Indian universities, and between the academy and the private sector.

- English language and Literature
- India – EU relations
- Inter-Religious Dialogue
- Gender and Indian politics
- Communications, Journalism, Media Studies

### Criteria

Applicants must have a Masters Degree and excellent academic grades. The PhD programme will provide significant mentoring support and therefore scholars must be resident in Dublin. All positions will begin on 1 October 2016.
