Semester Two Exam Results

Advice for Students

Exam results for semester one will be published online on Wednesday 22nd June. Results will be available from here - <u>https://examresults.dcu.ie/</u>

First year students - Please note that all results are now confirmed by the Programme Amendment Board. Student must now appeal if they wish to have a grade changed (see conditions on appeals at <u>www.dcu.ie/students/az/appeals</u>). Clarification on results codes and resit dates, please go to <u>www.dcu.ie/registry/examinations/resits.shtml</u>

Consultation Days: This takes place from Thursday 23rd and Friday 24th June. All students can contact their lecturer to receive feedback on their assessments regardless if you passed or failed. Please request feedback so you understand where you need to improve if you failed an element of assessment.

Compensation General Rule: If a student fails less than 10 credits and the grade is 35-39%, they may be compensated at the June Boards. Please read the Marks & Standards document and contact your Chairperson for confirmation. Some programmes may have alternative rules. Appeals: Students may appeal a result once the June Boards have met and confirmed all results. It is important that a student seeks feedback on their exam during Consultation Days. There must be genuine reasons for an appeal. Appeals deadline is 4th July 2016. For more information, see - https://www4.dcu.je/students/az/appeals

Resits: For those who deferred/absent/failed an exam in January/May, they can resit 8th – 20th August. The cost is €190 in total (subject to change). Students must contact the lecturer directly regarding assignments as it will be dealt with separately. Also see <u>https://www.dcu.ie/registry/examinations/resits.shtml</u> for more information.

Extenuating Circumstances: This is not available at this stage. You must appeal stating you had Extenuating Circumstances that you did not bring to the board originally.

Unhappy with Programme: Students may request an internal transfer to another programme up until July 1st. Students should contact the chairperson of the programme that you are interested in as some programmes are high demand. Students must have passed their 60 credits in first year and will have to return to first year of new programme in 16/17.
