- 3. Modules in the same subject must be taken in numerical order, except where two numerically adjacent modules are taken together in the same year, i.e. taking LIT2 and LIT3 together.
- 4. You may select no more than two modules from the same subject in any academic year.
- 5. Lit6: Please note that this advanced module involves the completion of a dissertation. This type of module requires a high level of commitment and therefore students registering for Lit6 should carefully consider the number of other modules they take in that academic year (the feasibility of taking this module in combination with other modules will, of course, depend on the capability of the student and the amount of time the student can dedicate to their studies).
- 6. His6: Please note that this advanced module involves the completion of a dissertation. This type of module requires a high level of commitment and therefore students registering for His6 should carefully consider the number of modules they take in that academic year (the feasibility of taking this module in combination with other modules will, of course, depend on the capability of the student and the amount of time the student can dedicate to their studies).
