1.3. Eligibility requirements

Graduates of Graduate Diploma in Inclusive Education, Learning Support and Special Education (GDILS).

- 1.3.1. Students must have successfully completed either SI708 Autistic Spectrum Disorders or SI718 Applied Behaviour Analysis in Education
- 1.3.2. Students must have completed an Autism focused placement as part of GDILS programme, subject to approval by the Progression and Awards Board.
- 1.3.3. Skills requirement: GDILS students must complete an extra 5 credit module in Year 2 of the programme, as follows:

3.1 Credits for progression

Students must successfully have completed a minimum of 30 credits Year 1 in order to progress to Year 2.

3.2 Carrying of modules

Students will not be permitted to 'carry' modules under any circumstances.

3.3 Exit Awards

Upon completion of 30 credits students may exit with may exit with a Graduate Certificate in the Education of Pupils on the Autism Spectrum as indicated in the academic structure.

Upon completion of 60 credits students may exit with may exit with a Graduate Diploma in Education in Autism as indicated in the academic structure.
