Biographical History:

Henry Morris was a writer and Irish scholar, born on 14 January 1874 in Lisdoonan, Donaghmoyne, Co. Monaghan, Ireland. Morris was a teacher and school inspector for the Department of Education, collector of 18th and 19th century Irish manuscripts, and involved in the revival of Irish language and antiquarian studies.

Archival History:

Bound Volume acquired by St. Patrick's College in the 1990s.

Scope and Content:

Album of correspondence, press-cuttings, autographs, warrants, postcards, invitations, and receipts, collected by Henry Morris. Album correspondence creators, recipients, and subjects are listed in C3/1.

Arrangement:

Bound volume accumulated and arranged by Morris.
