Research Opportunities

Several research project have taken place over the past year in which AFU participants have taken parrt. Research is essential to the university and the wonderful expertise of the participants is valued and appreciated by the research community.

AFU participant Joe Brennan reported on the Captain Project he has been involved in:

CAPTAIN's workshop took place in the School of Nursing and Human Science in DCU on the 21 st March. CAPTAIN stands for Coach Assistant via Projected and Tangible Interface. This project is managed by Dr. Louise Hopper and her research assistant, Joanne Carroll. It is funded by the EU (H2020) and similar workshops are taking place in Greece, Spain, Italy and Cyprus. Dr. Hopper commenced the session by reminding the large attendance of the purpose of this research; i.e. to assist the independence of older adults in their own homes through technology. The attendees were provided with some fictional case histories for discussion as regards suggestions for solutions. The meeting then broke into groups of three or four to discuss what we considered were the common problems in each case. My group of four discussed a large variety of concerns and how we thought technology could help e.g., Alarms/reminders, fire, gas, smoke, loss of sight, loss of hearing and, nutrition. We also discussed such concerns as: acceptance of old age and power of attorney. Finally, attendees were advised that a daily diary, specifically designed for this project, was now available and volunteers from the meeting would be most welcome.

Socatel Project

A partnership project between the HSE,TCD,DCU and a European consortium has invited AFU participant Catherine Clancy, to take part in testing an online platform for co-creation. An online platform is like a community centre where people can meet and exchange views, with the difference that it is online and accessible 24/7. It is hoped that in it's final version a wide range of people will use the platform to co-create services for older people.
