What should I attend?



You will register for core(mandatory) and perhaps some optional modules.

Your module codes will be on your registration schedule which you can find here: dcu.ie/registry/registration-schedules-search In the above example:

- EF114[1]L1/04 is an activity scheduled for 10am on a Monday morning.
- EF114 is the module code for Introduction to Macroeconomics
- [1] is semester 1, during semester 2 this will appear as [2]
- L1 = Lecture 1 (These can be T (Tutorials), P (Practicals) etc)
- /04 = Group 4, You will be contacted by your faculty/school allocating you to a group
- 1-6, 8-12 indicate the weeks of the academic year the activity will be taught

The remaining digits are the room number on that

Finding your way...

A location code is made up of the Campus code, followed by the building, followed by the floor, followed by the room number e.g. GLA.QG13 Campus Codes are:

GLA = Glasnevin Campus SPD = St Patricks Campus SPD.AHC = All Hallows Campus

The first letter on the location indicates the Building/

Block listed on the campus map.

GLA.QG13, is room 13 on the ground floor of the Business School on the Glasnevin campus.
