| Story   | Read the story from On Line pupils book or dramatise the story.   |

| Poem    | Page 103 On Line and in pupils textbook (or new poem if you did the task p.103 of rewriting the poem).  |
| Pupil 4 | So the message of the poem and the story Jesus told is that we need to love God   |
