#### We pray together

- You need: 1) To have taught the lesson We pray together (Lesson 21) Moving On  
 2) Dramatise the themes of sorry and thanks if wished and the poem p. 193.  
 3) Stop sign

Narrator 1	Last week in R.E. we learned how to STOP (hold up STOP sign)
Narrator 2	(Walks along and suddenly stops) Do you mean like this?.
Narrator 1	No. To stop and pray
Pupil 1	What is praying?
Pupil 2	It's talking with God.
Pupil 1	When can you pray?
Pupil 2	Anytime
Pupil 1	Where can you pray?
Pupil 2	Anywhere
Pupil 1	What words do you use?
Pupil 2	Usually Dear God at the start and Amen at the end
Pupil 1	What goes in the middle?
Narrator 1	STOP
Narrator 2	(Walks past and stops) Do you mean like this?
Narrator 1	S is for Sorry
Possible short drama scene Pupil 4	I know I have done wrong God. Forgive me
Narrator 1	Saying sorry is important. In church there is always a sorry prayer. Let's go back to STOP
Narrator 2	(Walks past and stops). What's the T in Stop?
Narrator 1	T is for Thanks
Group do prayer from p.

Narrator 1	Saying thanks is important too. Now STOP
Narrator 2	(stops). O is for....
Narrator 1	Others. We can ask God to help others
Pupil 5	We can pray for others who are sick
Pupil 6	People in other parts of the world
Pupil 7	Our families
Narrator 1	In church there are always prayers for other people. There is one more letter in the word STOP
Narrator 2	(stops) P is for
Narrator 1	Please
Pupil 8	That's when we can pray to God about our own needs.
Pupil 9	That's the easiest part of the prayer
Narrator 1	God listens to all the parts of the prayer, but we can't tell God what to answer.
Prayer readers	Prayers based on the 4 parts of STOP
Narrator 2	Let's all STOP and say the Lord's Prayer

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
