Welcome

Welcome to the DCU 2021 Open Day. On Saturday 20th November, you are welcome to visit our DCU St Patrick's and DCU Glasnevin Campuses from 10am to 2pm to attend course talks, campus tours, our Clubs and Societies exhibition, and much more!

Access to Indoor Spaces

In compliance with Government Guidelines, DCU will be requesting that visitors present their **EU Digital COVID Certificate or proof of immunity from Covid19 plus photo ID in order to enter our buildings on campus (if you do not have photo ID, you can present another form of ID that shows your name, such as a bank card)**. To make this process easier, please take note of the following guidelines:

There will be four Information points on DCU Glasnevin campus and two on DCU St Patrick's campus where COVID certs will be checked (see campus map for locations marked 'i' - DCU Glasnevin Campus: Collins Ave Entrance, Helix, Interfaith Centre, in front of 'U' Student Centre; DCU St Patrick's Campus: Cregan Library and St Patrick's College Chapel)

When you arrive on a DCU campus

1. Bring your COVID cert/photo ID to an Information checkpoint
2. Receive a 'DCU Open Day' stamp on your hand and wristband to gain access to indoor spaces - the stamp/wristband allows a fast pass into the building you wish to visit
3. If you do not have this stamp/wristband, you will be asked to present your COVID cert/photo ID at the entrance to each building you wish to visit.
4. Once inside the building you can visit Information Stands/ Demonstrations or attend a DCU course talk that you have registered for.

DCU Course/Support Talks

1. You must register for all DCU talks in advance of the open day
2. Registration for talks will close on Wednesday 17th November or when capacity is reached. If you arrive at the DCU campus without registering, you will only be admitted to a DCU talk if capacity allows.
3. Your name will be checked against the list of registered names for entrance to a DCU talk
4. Please arrive on time to a talk - you will have a 2 minute grace period after which your place may be given to another.
5. Priority will be given to students for entrance to talks
6. Parent/Guardian access will depend on room capacity
7. The data you provide to register for a DCU talk will be deleted within one week of the open day

Public Toilets

There will be two public toilet locations that you can visit without showing your COVID cert/photo ID:

1. Ground floor of 'U' Student Centre, DCU Glasnevin Campus
2. Sports Centre, DCU St Patrick's Campus

Demonstrations and Tours

Selected Schools within the Faculty of Science and Health will provide tours and/or demonstrations in the labs, skills centres and atrium of the Lonsdale (X) Building and in the Nursing (H) Building.

Media facilities including the TV and Radio studios in the School of Communications and the language and translation laboratories in the School of Applied Language and Intercultural Studies will be open to visit to those who have registered to attend the subject talks.

The Faculty of Engineering and Computing will also be conducting a wide range of demonstrations in the Stokes (S) Building.

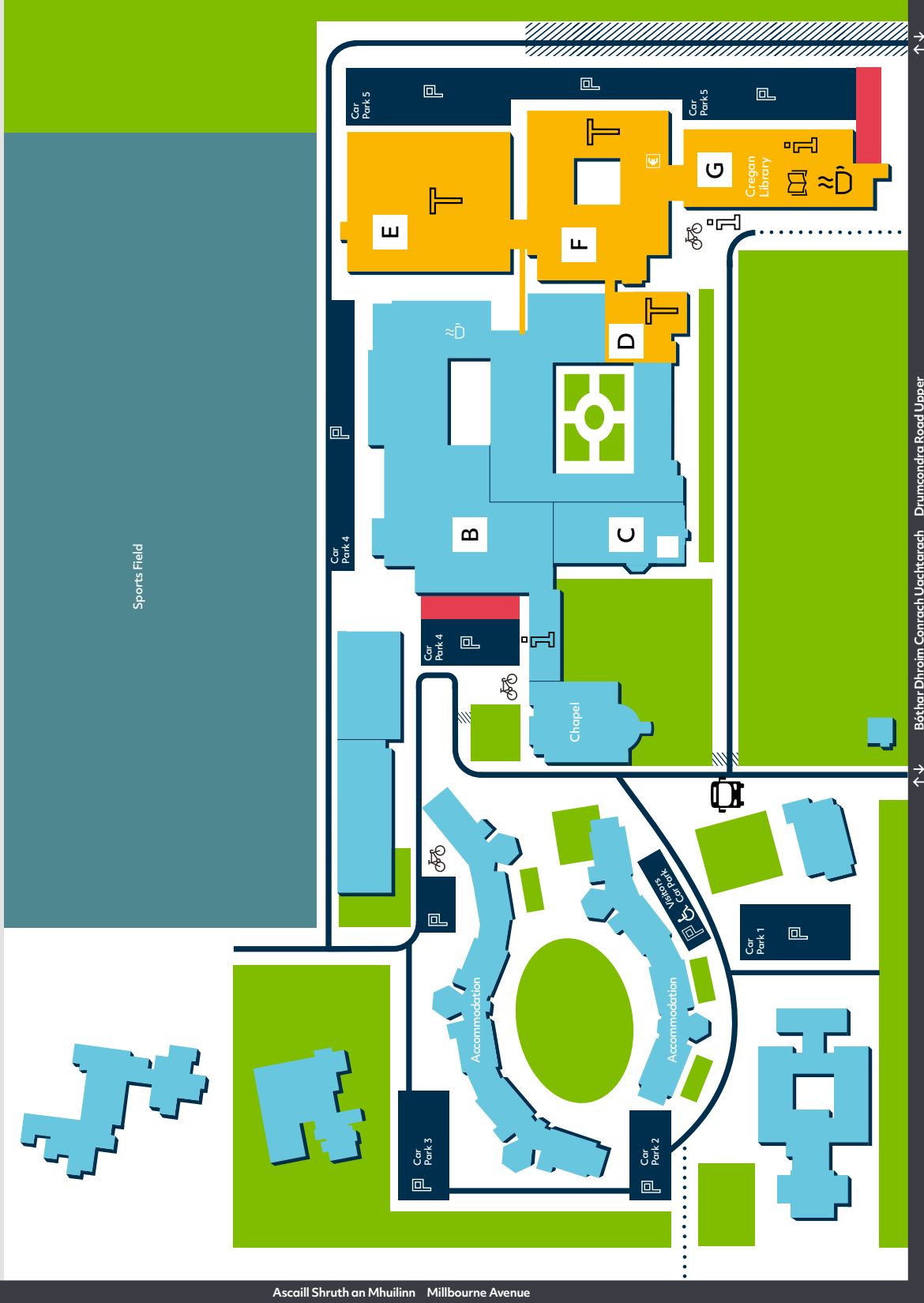
