### 2. Minutes of the meeting of 25 June 2015

- 3.1 It was <u>noted</u> that resolution of Course Builder issues (university wide agreed descriptors for GTE modules) was awaiting the introduction of a new version of Course Builder in 2015 and will be addressed in this academic year (Item 3.2).

It was <u>noted</u> that Ms Rachel Keegan had worked with Schools to apply the standard template for the presentation of PhD pathways as listed above, and the improved documentation would be used at the orientation for research students to promote the take-up of pathways. It was further <u>noted</u> that very positive aspects had come out of the development of structured pathways in that students with teaching related responsibilities were being asked by Faculties to complete the Postgraduate Tutoring Principles and Practice and Research Integrity training.

It was <u>noted</u> that PhD pathways for the Faculty of Science and Health and Faculty of Computing and Engineering would be considered by Graduate Research Studies Board in October 2015.

## 5. Incorporation and Graduate Research

Progress to date with respect to Incorporation was reported and the following were noted:

- Ten research students (6 in Education and 4 in Humanities) across St. Patrick's College and Mater Dei Institute have been made offers through the Postgraduate Applications Centre (PAC)
- Communication with continuing research students is underway
- A training/orientation session for staff in SPD and MDI supervising new DCU research students will take place in St. Patrick's College on 10 September 2015. Staff from SPD and MDI will also participate in postgraduate orientation in DCU.

This item was deferred.

# 7. Proposed change to Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research and Thesis (re-wording of Paragraph 10.2.6)

Dr B. White provided the context to the change as proposed by the Faculty of Science and Health indicating that the regulation which precludes the nomination of more than one external examiner from the same school or department in the same institution within a given academic year causes difficulties in the Schools of Biotechnology and Chemical Sciences. This was often due to the specialised nature of the disciplines sought and the shortage of experts, particularly across Ireland and the UK. She indicated that it was her understanding that the suggestion for an external examiner comes from the individual supervisor and often it is accidental that another colleague may also suggest a researcher from the same department in the same institution.

It was clarified at this point, as per the regulations that the Head of School is responsible for external examiner nominations, and in order to avoid nominating two external examiners from the one department in the same institution, he/she is provided with a list of external examiners and their affiliations at the outset of the academic year.

Following a brief discussion on this aspect of the proposal, it was agreed that the regulation may be relaxed somewhat, given the specific difficulties cited, however it was felt there had been a sound rationale for introducing it in the initial instance and the impact of any softening of the regulation would need to be monitored closely. It was <u>agreed</u> that the Chair would propose a revised wording reflective of the discussion for the consideration of the next meeting of GRSB.

The second element of the rewording of paragraph 10.2.6 proposed a change to the role and responsibility of the Head of School in the nomination process. Having

considered practice in other institutions there was consensus that the Head of School should retain the responsibility as outlined in the *Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research and Thesis* and the proposal to change the wording was <u>not agreed</u>.

# 9. Notification of Intention to Submit for Examination (PGR4) (nomination of internal and external examiners)

In advance of the review of the PGR4 forms the Chair sought the views of the Board on the interpretation of the stipulation in the *Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research and Thesis* that the internal examiner should be 'experienced in supervising research students' (Paragraph 10.1).

In the discussion which followed on the definition of 'experience', it was emphasised that it is important to provide research students with examiners with an appropriate understanding of research award standards in their discipline, drawn from experience broader than their own doctoral work. A consensus view was that supervising to completion or supervising a number of students through the confirmation process would be an appropriate interpretation of the regulation. The importance of provision of opportunities for the development of new academic staff in the skills of examination and supervision of research students, and growing that capacity was also emphasised. Following discussion it was agreed that more specific guidelines on the experience necessary to be an internal examiner should be provided on the PGR4 form. The Chair indicated that she would draft guidelines in line with the discussion for the approval of GRSB at its October 2015 meeting.
