Introduction

As part of its continuing development, the School of Law and Government intends to appoint a Lecturer in Law. The appointment, for a fixed term of five years, will commence on 1 September 2014.

Applications from candidates with demonstrated third-level lecturing experience and academic research expertise in any area of law are welcome. The school has particular needs for expertise in the areas of private law and that may be a factor in short-listing and final selection.

Applicants for the post must hold an honours degree in Law, should be qualified to a post-graduate level and have completed a Doctoral qualification in Law. The successful candidate will also have a minimum of three years relevant experience, with a record of high quality university-level teaching.

The successful candidate will be committed to high-quality research, and publication in leading, international peer-reviewed journals and/ or with high-quality book publishers. They will contribute to the scholarship and intellectual life of the School by conducting research which will enhance the School's reputation as a research-led teaching institution and which will make a significant contribution to the University's Socio-Legal Research Centre.

The successful candidate will be expected to contribute significantly to curriculum development, teaching and administrative activity in the School of Law and Government. They will make a substantial contribution to the development and delivery of the School's existing taught programmes, and in the planning and curriculum delivery of future developments in law. The successful candidate will have a firm commitment to excellence in teaching and learning, the continuing enhancement of the student experience, and an understanding of innovative teaching and learning methods.

The successful candidate will also have demonstrated that their work can contribute to the national and international public debate and will have shown that they have an interest in, and the potential to, win external funding.
