The Chair <u>noted</u> that it had been proposed, in discussion between the Director of Registry, Ms Phylomena McMorrow, and himself, that the Student Awards Manager, Ms Gillian Barry, be invited to join the GSB as the second of the two co-opted members for whom there is provision in the terms of reference. The GSB <u>approved</u> this proposal. As Ms Barry was unavailable to attend the present meeting, Ms Celine Jameson, Student Enrolment Manager, attended in her stead.

SECTION A: MINUTES AND RELATED ISSUES

1. Adoption of agenda

2. Minutes of the meeting of 14 January 2010

3. Matters arising from the minutes

- **3.1** <u>Noted</u> that a proposal on the provision of academic writing skills for research students would be made to the 6 May 2010 meeting of the GSB. (Item 3.2)
- **3.2** <u>Noted</u> that, in the case of a student in respect of whom consideration was being given to readmission to the PhD track subject to improved performance, no further discussion was required because the student now intended to graduate with a Master's degree by research subject to successful examination. (Item 3.3)
- **3.3** <u>Noted</u> that the new scholarship scheme would be named 'Daniel O'Hare Research Scholarships' and that it would be discussed at the meeting of the Research Advisory Panel of 10 March 2010 and advertised as soon as possible after that. (Item 3.5)
- **3.4** <u>Noted</u> that discussions were in progress about two requests for changes to supervisory arrangements. (Item 3.14)
- **3.5** <u>Noted</u> that it had been agreed by the Subgroup of the University Standards Committee which had met on 26 January 2010 (and the minutes of which had been approved by the USC on 4 February 2010) that the university's Marks and Standards would apply in their entirety to Graduate Training Elements. This means that a DCU graduate training module must have a minimum credit rating of five, though modules with lesser credit ratings, taken in other institutions, will be recognised as contributing to students' awards. Another consequence is that, where a student fails a module in an academic session, he/she must re-register for it (or for an appropriate alternative module) in the next or a subsequent academic session. (Item 3.16)
- **3.6** <u>Noted</u> that resources had been allocated to ensure the availability in the Registry of a project manager (Ms Claudine Devereux) to oversee the administration of Graduate Training Elements and that Ms Devereux would assume this post as soon as possible. (Item 3.17)
- **3.7** <u>Noted</u> that a candidate had been transferred to the PhD register by means of Chair's action following clarification of an issue with the Head of School. (Item 4.4)
- **3.8** <u>Noted</u> that discussion had taken place with a Director of a Research Centre about the inclusion of the name of a School on forms submitted to the GSB. (Item 4.15)
- **3.9.1** <u>Agreed</u> that the Chair would contact all relevant stakeholders (these to be determined by discussion between him and Registry staff) to stipulate that all substantive information on all forms submitted for consideration by the GSB must be typewritten, as distinct from handwritten, and that forms will not be considered

<u>Agreed</u> that such a transfer should be facilitated where appropriate. <u>Noted</u> that, where a transfer took place, taught modules already completed by the student would be recorded on his/her transcript of results in the same way that all other Graduate Training Elements are recorded. <u>Agreed</u> that a new form to cover such a transfer would be required. See also Item 9.1 below.

SECTION C: POLICY AND STRATEGY ISSUES

- 8. Proposed graduate education modules
- 8.1 GS6XX: Postgraduate Tutor/Demonstrator Course

8.2 GS601: Intellectual Property and Commercialisation

The availability of these two modules was welcomed in principle. Approval was deferred pending discussion between the Chair and Dr Blin about issues that had been raised by the Associate Deans for Teaching and Learning/Education, including procedures for approving such modules prior to submission to the GSB and the desirability of using Coursebuilder to present the module descriptors. The discussion will take as starting points the following, which were agreed: (a) Coursebuilder should be used as the default module descriptor template, though there needs to be formal agreement on this as well as communication to all stakeholders (Ms McDermott is to raise these issues with the Deputy President/Registrar); (b) modules which are proposed as Graduate Training Elements should be approved by Faculty Research Committees prior to submission to the GSB, except that where modules are not attached to Schools/Faculties they will be sent by the module co-ordinators to the Graduate Research Office for approval there prior to submission to the GSB (the Chair is to raise these issues at the meeting of the University Standards Committee of 1 April 2010). It was noted that, at the Education Committee meeting of 3 March 2010, a presentation on integrating teaching and research had been made by Ms Morag Munro, Acting Head of the Learning Innovation Unit, and Dr Declan Raftery, Director of Research Support Services, and <u>agreed</u> that the notes relating to this presentation would be made available to the GSB. It was <u>noted</u> that a module on Research Ethics would be submitted from the Graduate Research Office to the 6 May 2010 meeting of the GSB.

9. Draft revised Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research and Thesis

- 9.1 The following amendments were <u>approved</u>:
 - Section 1.1 The Chair will add a sentence to explain in more detail what is envisaged by a Supervisory Panel.
 - Section 2.8 It will be specified that appeals are handled by the Graduate Research Office and not by the Registry.
 - Section 3 A reference to standard transfer procedures from professional/taught doctorates to PhD programmes will be included (see also Item 7.3 above).
 - Section 6 A section 6.24 will be added to specify that research students are subject to the university's code of discipline.
 - Section 8.5 There will be a reference to the word length of the thesis associated with a professional/taught doctorate (and the PGR4 – notification of intention to submit thesis for examination – form will be amended accordingly). It will be stated that minimum acceptable word length is a matter for the supervisor to agree with the student.
 - Section 8.9 The wording will be modified on the basis of advice which the Chair is expecting from Invent
- **9.2** <u>Agreed</u> that, where it is considered that research proposals need to be screened to detect possible plagiarism, the mechanisms for doing this should be determined at School level and the issue should not form part of *Academic Regulations*.
- **9.3** The following were <u>noted</u>:
 - Further discussion needs to take place between the Chair and the Registry about Sections 11.3.1 and 12.1.
 - The structure of the document needs further revision.
 - A section on Graduate Training Elements needs to be added.

- The inclusion of a workflow diagram would be helpful. Dr Brabazon undertook to prepare such a diagram.
- **9.4** It was <u>agreed</u> that the above four matters would be addressed within a short time and that the revised *Regulations* would be subject to final agreement by the Chair and the Associate Deans for Research and then circulated, first to the GSB and subsequently to the Faculty Research Committees, by 16 March 2010. The FRCs will be requested to provide feedback, via the Associate Deans for Research, so as to inform further discussion at the GSB meeting of 6 May 2010. This timeline and these procedures are as agreed by the GSB at its meeting of 14 January 2010 (Item 9.3).

10. Any other business

<u>Noted</u> that a representative of the Associate Deans for Research would join the discussions aimed at agreeing procedures for the implementation of the PAC system for research student applications from September 2010.
