The Chair welcomed those present to the inaugural meeting of the Graduate Studies Board.

## 1. Adoption of agenda

The agenda was adopted subject to the inclusion of seven new submissions under Item 5, one new submission under Item 7 and one submission under Item 11.

#### 2. Membership

- 2.1 <u>Noted</u> that, with effect from the next meeting, that of Thursday 1 November, Dr Blin would be the representative of the Associate Deans for Teaching and Learning on the GSB.
- 2.2 <u>Noted</u> that, since Professor Forster was about to complete his term of office as Associate Dean for Research in the Faculty of Science and Health, this was his only opportunity to attend a meeting of the GSB. Dr Murphy thanked Professor Forster for his (necessarily brief) involvement in the GSB.

2.3 <u>Noted</u> that it was likely that a postgraduate research student, rather than the Education and Welfare Officer of the Students' Union, would act as the student representative on the GSB and that Dr Murphy would discuss this matter further with the Union.

## 3. Terms of reference and method of operation

- **3.1** <u>Agreed</u> that it would be necessary for the GSB to be closely involved in the formulation of policy about graduate studies issues as well as in decisions relating to individual student matters.
- **3.2** <u>Agreed</u> that the GSB should report to Academic Council and that significant policy issues relating to graduate studies would also need to be brought to the attention of the University Standards Committee. <u>Noted</u>, in regard to the latter issue, that Dr Murphy would henceforth be a member of the USC.
- **3.3** <u>Noted</u> that Dr Murphy would e-mail draft terms of reference for the GSB to the members as soon as possible. <u>Noted</u> that the President had requested that the terms of reference be submitted for approval to Executive, and that they would also need to be submitted for approval to Academic Council.

## 4. Proposed amendment to Section 7.4 of Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research and Thesis

<u>Agreed</u> that the existing wording, with the addition of a general reference to the fact that the student was, to the best of his/her knowledge, not in breach of any law, would be at least as likely to clarify the copyright issue as the proposed new wording. <u>Agreed</u> that Dr Murphy, Dr Raftery and Mr Paul Sheehan, Director of Library Services, would meet to agree a final wording on this basis, having first ascertained what type of wording is used in institutions comparable to the University.

<u>Noted</u>, in relation to all the above requests, that information was awaited from the Finance Office as to whether or not the old 'write-up' fee might be applied to them.

<u>Agreed</u> that, notwithstanding the desirability of encouraging students to complete their research without undue delay, a 'write-up' fee was still required for students about to complete but needing to register in the following academic year. <u>Agreed</u> that Dr Murphy would convey this view to the Finance Office and the University Executive. <u>Agreed</u> that any 'write-up' permission should be for a maximum of one year.

## 11.1 Examination of PhD thesis

<u>Noted</u> that an external examiner had expressed reservations about the standard of a thesis submitted for examination. <u>Agreed</u> that Dr Murphy and Dr Ruskin would discuss the matter with the two supervisors involved and propose the following alternatives to them: (a) the examination process to be completed, i.e. the internal examiner's report to be submitted and the *viva voce* examination to be held; (b) the student to withdraw the thesis and undertake very substantial research leading to a new thesis, with a minimum time limit to be set in view of the considerable workload that would be involved.

The importance of ensuring that a thesis had reached a minimum acceptable standard before being submitted for examination was <u>noted</u>.

<u>Agreed</u> that the relevant section (6.1) of *Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research and Thesis* would need to be revised to ensure that procedures for appeal of an examination result reflected current structures within Faculties.

# 11.2 Distribution of GSB agenda and papers

<u>Agreed</u> that electronic distribution would be preferable to paper distribution. <u>Agreed</u> that the logistical issues involved would be discussed between Dr Murphy, Ms McDermott and Ms Devereux.
