Project idea and researcher opportunities

<u>Research Field</u>:

Marta Rocchi's research currently focuses on the ethics of artificial intelligence and the new perspectives of business ethics in the future of work; she has an active line of research also on virtue ethics in business and finance, with a focus on both conceptual contributions and teaching implications. She would be open to discuss projects in one of these lines of research, or in similar fields.

Researcher Requirements

- The researcher must fulfil the MSCA-PF mobility¹ and should not be more than 8 years post PhD at the deadline of the call.
- Applicants should have a PhD in a relevant area of business ethics/finance ethics/ethics of artificial intelligence and demonstrate a promising track record of early research achievements.

¹ **Recruited researchers must comply with the following mobility rule**: they must not have resided or carried out their main activity (work, studies, etc.) in the country of the beneficiary (for European Postdoctoral Fellowships), or the host organisation for the outgoing phase (for Global Postdoctoral Fellowships) for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before the call deadline (<u>https://bit.ly/39QTUQg</u>). Furthermore, regarding Global Fellowships, applicants must be nationals, or long-term residents, of an EU Member State or Associated Country. (Long-term residents definition: a period of at least 5 consecutive years spent in an EU Member State or Associated Country, prior to the 14th September 2022).

- 1. A short CV complete with a list of publication
- 2. A one-page research proposal
- 3. A short statement with indication of why DCU and the relevant faculty/school/research centre would be the best host institution for your research project
