Ollscoil Chathair Bhaile Átha Cliath

Is ollscoil cheannródaíoch nuálach Eorpach í Ollscoil Chathair Bhaile Átha Cliath (OCBÁC). Tá bród orainn go bhfuilimid ar cheann de na hOllscoileanna Óga atá chun tosaigh ar leibhéal domhanda agus go bhfuilimid áirithe ar an 2% is fearr ar domhan. Tá OCBÁC aitheanta mar Ollscoil Tionchair na hÉireann, agus é mar mhisean againn ‘saol daoine agus an tsochaí a bhunathrú chun feabhais’ trí bhéim a chur ar dhul i ngleic le Dúshláin Dhomhanda i gcomhar le príomh-chomhpháirtithe náisiúnta agus idirnáisiúnta agus le páirtithe leasmhara.

Tá breis is 20,000 mac léinn ag freastal ar OCBÁC, agus iad i gcúig dhámh sna trí champas acadúla i gceantar Ghlas Naíon-Dhroim Conrach i mBaile Átha Cliath Thuaidh. A bhuí lena cur chuige nuálach i leith an teagaisc agus na foghlama, fágann a seal san Ollscoil ‘lorg láidir ar na mic léinn’, rud a fhorbraíonn céimithe a mbíonn an-tóir orthu. Tá OCBÁC ag Uimh.1 in Éirinn faoi láthair maidir le Ráta Fostaíochta Céimithe, agus maidir le hioncam céimithe (an Phríomh-Oifig Staidrimh).

Is Ollscoil a chuireann béim láidir ar thaighde í OCBÁC agus tá roinnt Ionad Taighde atá á maoiniú ag Fondúireacht Eolaíochta Éireann lonnaithe inti. Tá an Ollscoil rannpháirteach i roinnt comhpháirtíochtaí taighde Eorpacha agus idirnáisiúnta. Is í OCBÁC an phríomh-ollscoil in Éirinn chomh maith maidir le haistriú teicneolaíochta faoi mar a léiríonn ceadúnú maoine intleachtúla

Is institiúid ‘Tús Áite do Dhaoine’ í OCBÁC atá tiomanta don Chomhionannas, don Éagsúlacht agus don Ionchuimsiú - Ollscoil a chabhraíonn leis an bhfoireann agus le mic léinn ionas go mbeidh rath orthu. Tá an Ollscoil ar thús cadhnaíochta maidir leis an obair a dhéanann sí chun rochtain ar oideachas a mhéadú, agus tá sí áirithe ar na 10 n-ollscoil is fearr ar domhan ó thaobh míchothromaíochtaí a laghdú i Rangú an Times ar Thionchar an Ardoideachais.

An Institiúid Oideachais

Is í Institiúid Oideachais OCBÁC an dámh is nuaí in Ollscoil Chathair Bhaile Átha Cliath. Tá sí lonnaithe i bhfoirgneamh saintógtha úrscothach ar Champas Phádraig OCBÁC i nDroim Conrach, Baile Átha Cliath. Bunaíodh an dámh in 2016, agus ba í an chéad dámh ollscoile oideachais in Éirinn í. Bhunaigh OCBÁC a cúigiú dámh, an ceann is nuaí fós, mar creideann sí go láidir go bhfuil sé ríthábhachtach staidéar agus taighde a dhéanamh i réimse an oideachais chomh maith le múinteoirí agus teagascóirí a ullmhú, agus tacaíocht a thabhairt dóibh, mar cabhraíonn na nithe seo le saol na ndaoine a athrú chun feabhais. Tá tuairim is 4,000 mac léinn ag freastal ar an Institiúid agus tá 3,500 díobh seo ar chlár a bhfuil baint láidir acu le socrúchán scoile. Cuireann an Dámh sé chlár fochéime mhúinte agus 21 clár iarchéime múinte ar fáil, agus tá 153 duine ar an bhfoireann acadúil i sé scoil idirdhisciplíneacha.

Scoil na Teanga, na Litearthachta agus an Oideachais Luath-Óige

Tá Scoil na Teanga, na Litearthachta agus an Oideachais Luath-Óige ar cheann de na sé scoil de chuid Institiúid Oideachais OCBÁC. Tá baint lárnach ag an scoil le réimse leathan céimeanna agus cúrsaí eile san oideachas ag leibhéal fochéime agus ag leibhéal iarchéime. Tugann sí dámh mhór fhuinniúil le chéile, baill foirne a bhfuil saineolas suntasach acu maidir le teoiric, cleachtas, taighde agus beartas i réimsí na Teanga, na Litearthachta agus an Oideachais Luath-Óige. Tá an fhoireann tiomanta do scoláireacht agus d'fhiosrúchán leanúnach i gcomhpháirtíocht chómhálartach le suíomhanna an oideachais luath-óige agus le suíomhanna cúraim luath-óige, le scoileanna, le comhghleacaithe ar fud na hinstitiúide agus le páirtithe leasmhara eile sa chóras oideachais.

Tá an post seo lonnaithe ar Champas Phádraig de chuid Ollscoil Chathair Bhaile Átha Cliath agus beidh an té a cheapfar freagrach don Cheann Scoile.
