Background & Role

DCU Anti-Bullying Centre (ABC) is a University Designated Research Centre located within DCU's Institute of Education. It hosts the prestigious **UNESCO Chair on Bullying Cyberbullying** and **International Journal on Bullying Prevention.** ABC leads the field of research, resource development and training in tackling bullying and online safety in Ireland and is an internationally recognised centre of excellence in bullying research. The Centre is dedicated to the study of bullying behaviour/online safety in schools, organisations, and workplaces and to the development of education and training to support employers, employees, schools, teachers, students, and parents to prevent and intervene in bullying situations and to promote online safety.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities

This post is subject to continuing external funding. The successful candidate will work with Principal Investigators on a number of externally funded projects assisting in planning, implementing and analysing qualitative and quantitative data sets. The post-holder will support the PIs in the day-to-day running of projects, communication with relevant parties as required, and meeting the deliverables of the project including drafting reports and academic papers.

The main tasks of the post-holder include the following:

- Undertaking a specified programme of research on bullying and related issues in a variety of organisational settings (e.g., reviewing the literature in this field; selecting validated instruments).
- Developing and delivering an online survey aimed to assess bullying among target groups in different settings.
- Contributing to appropriate dissemination material and results of the research (i.e., producing high quality scientific publications, reports) in which the post-holder will engage under the mentorship of the Principal Investigator.
- Delivering research outputs and providing input into the final report as required.
- Liaising with the funder institutions and attending and presenting the project results at project progress meetings.
- Contributing to all aspects of the research programme under the supervision and direction of the PI.
- Carrying out administrative work associated with the programme of research as necessary.

Qualifications, Skills and Experience Required

- Laboratory experience in social science research methods.
- Experience working on SPSS running descriptive, correlations, reliability, hierarchical regression, logistic regression anova, t-test, chi square test, and factor analysis on large datasets.)

- Experience in scientific databases search PubMed Scopus PsycINFO Google Scholar Google Docs
- Experience writing academic reports and papers.
- A demonstrated strong work ethic, as well as an independent and creative mind set and a deep commitment to problem-solving.
- Excellent interpersonal skills as well as verbal and written communication skills.
- Very good organisational skills with an ability to prioritise workloads and to work successfully on their own initiative.
