- Experience of working in Education settings, specifically in the context of Initial Teacher Education is highly desirable.
- Experience of budget management and procurement is highly desirable.
- Familiarity with all of the sciences physics, chemistry and biology is highly desirable.
- Experience and a good working knowledge of Information Technology would be advantageous.
