## 3. Course Presentations

DCU offers 60 plus undergraduate degree courses in the areas of Sustainability, Business, Languages, Arts, Humanities, Science, Health, Engineering, Computing, Education and Teaching. Each presentation will be 20-30 minutes in duration and will be repeated throughout the day.
