An Carn Community Association

Ireland | 1992

An Carn is a community association that was founded with the aim of regenerating the rural area of Sleacht Néill / Carn Tóchair in Co. Derry. An Carn has developed a range of different projects and enterprise ventures to support the regeneration of the community in a sustainable way.

Their main aim is to promote and restore the Irish language in the local area through their initiatives. Such initiatives include a café and restaurant, a nature reserve, an arts centre, and wind turbines. All financial surplus generated by these initiatives are reinvested into the community association. For example, the wind energy produced by the turbines is sold to the grid and the profits are reinvested into other ventures, such as the cafe and youth activities.

Biolite is a social enterprise that develops advanced clean energy technologies and distributes them to off-grid households around the world. The organisation serves two distinct groups of customers; outdoor recreation users and off-grid households, and has designed their products to fit both markets.

The profits that are generated from the outdoor recreation user market are reinvested to manufacture and distribute more Biolite products to off-grid households in the developing world.

Bounce Back Recycling

Ireland | 2017

Bounce Back Recycling is a social enterprise that provides employment and training opportunities to people that face barriers to employment. It's a recycling company with the goal of stopping as many mattresses and furniture ending up in landfill. The organisation works with many different groups to recycle unwanted waste. Using a social enterprise model, the income generated is used to pay operating expenses to run the business and to pay wages to employees.

This social enterprise provides national programmes across schools and youth and community settings, including supply of IT hardware, such as computers and laptops, as well as IT professional development training for educators and community workers.

Community Power

Ireland | 2012

Community Power is Ireland's very first community-owned renewable electricity supplier. The journey of Community Power began at the country's first community-owned wind farm, Templederry wind farm in Co. Tipperary. Since then, it has grown into a partnership made up of different community energy groups across the country that are working together to create a sustainable energy future that is community-led.

The electricity produced is sold to communities and the wider market. The profits generated are reinvested into the development of additional community-owned renewable energy generation facilities. As the organisation is community-owned, the surplus revenue stays within the communities, which helps contribute to a sustainable local economy.

The co-operative has developed an alternative tourism model that is more equitable and sustainable. It achieves this by charging a commission, where 50% of this commission is used to promote and fund local community projects.

FoodCloud

Ireland | 2013

FoodCloud is a social enterprise that transforms food surplus into opportunity by redistributing it from businesses and retailers to charities and community organisations.

FoodCloud facilitates the redistribution of food surplus using two different methods. The first is through FoodCloud Hubs, where surplus is delivered to for storage and subsequently sent out to FoodCloud charity and community partners. The second is directly through retail, where retailers and businesses can upload a description of the surplus food using their in-store scanner or the FoodCloud mobile app.

Refill Ireland Ireland | 2017

Refill Ireland is an organisation that aims to eradicate the need for single-use plastic bottles. It does this by:

- Mapping the locations of publicly accessible drinking water taps across the country
- Encouraging businesses to provide free tap water to customers
- Making free tap water accessible at least every 400 metres in towns and cities
- Encouraging local authorities and water utilities refurbish and install public drinking water taps

The organisation is a not-for-profit that generates revenue by selling sustainable products, such as indoor and outdoor drinking water dispensers, and reusable water bottles. The surplus is reinvested into continuing to reduce waste pollution in Ireland.
