1. Information Points

There will be four Open Day Information Points on the DCU Glasnevin Campus. 3. Course Presentations

DCU offers over 75 undergraduate degree courses in the areas of Sustainability, Business, Languages, Arts, Humanities, Science, Health, Engineering, Computing, Education and Teaching. The presentations will cover course content, choices within degrees, differences between similar degree courses, work placements and career prospects. Each presentation will be 20-30 minutes in duration and will be repeated throughout the day. So, for example, if you are interested in attending the Aviation Management talk, go to room Q122 in the Business School (Q) at 11.30am or 12.30pm.

6. Campus Tours

If you are considering studying at DCU, it is important that you get a feel for the campus. It's a wonderful place and it could be your home from home for the next three or four years. Highlights include student accommodation*, our award winning sports centre and the beautiful three-storey John and Aileen O' Reilly Library. Tours will depart from the "DCU Letters" in front of the Helix every half hour starting at 10.30am. The tour will take approximately 30 minutes with the last tour departing at 2.30pm.

*Please note that specific tours of student accommodation will start from the Accommodation information stand located in the 'U' Student Centre.

Demonstrations and Tours

Media facilities including the TV and Radio studios in the School of Communications and the **language and translation** laboratories in the School of Applied Language and Intercultural Studies will also be open to visitors.

VR Lab - Open for drop-in sessions

You'll learn about design-thinking and creative problem-solving through practical activities. Using both online and in-person learning, you'll get to work on real challenges faced by businesses.

Students are encouraged to look beyond the surface and imagine how setbacks could be reframed as a stepping stone to unexpected successes or valuable learning opportunities.


