Course Presentations

DCU offer more than 70 undergraduate degree courses in the areas of Sustainability, Business, Accounting, Marketing, Languages, Arts, Humanities, Music, Law, Science, Mathematics, Health, Engineering, Computing, Education and Teaching. The presentations will cover course content, choices within degrees, difference between similar degree courses, work placements and career prospects. Each presentation will be 20-30 minutes in duration and will be repeated throughout the day. So, for example, if you are interested in attending the '**Digital Business and Innovation**' presentation, go to room Q220 in the Business School (Q2 is the second floor of the Business School, room 20) at 10.30, 11.30 or 12.30 (Friday times for this presentation).

Demonstrations and Tours

Selected Schools within the Faculty of Science and Health will provide tours and/or demonstrations in the labs, skills centres. The starting point of these tours will be from the stands located in the atrium of the Lonsdale (X) Building and in the Nursing (H) Building.

Our VR lab will be open for demonstrations this Open Day from 12.30-3pm on Friday 17th November and 10am-2pm on Saturday 18th November but you will need to **book your slot** to take part, at the reception desk on the ground floor of the Business School, as spaces are limited.

The **Faculty of Engineering and Computing** will also be conducting a wide range of demonstrations in the Stokes (S) Building.

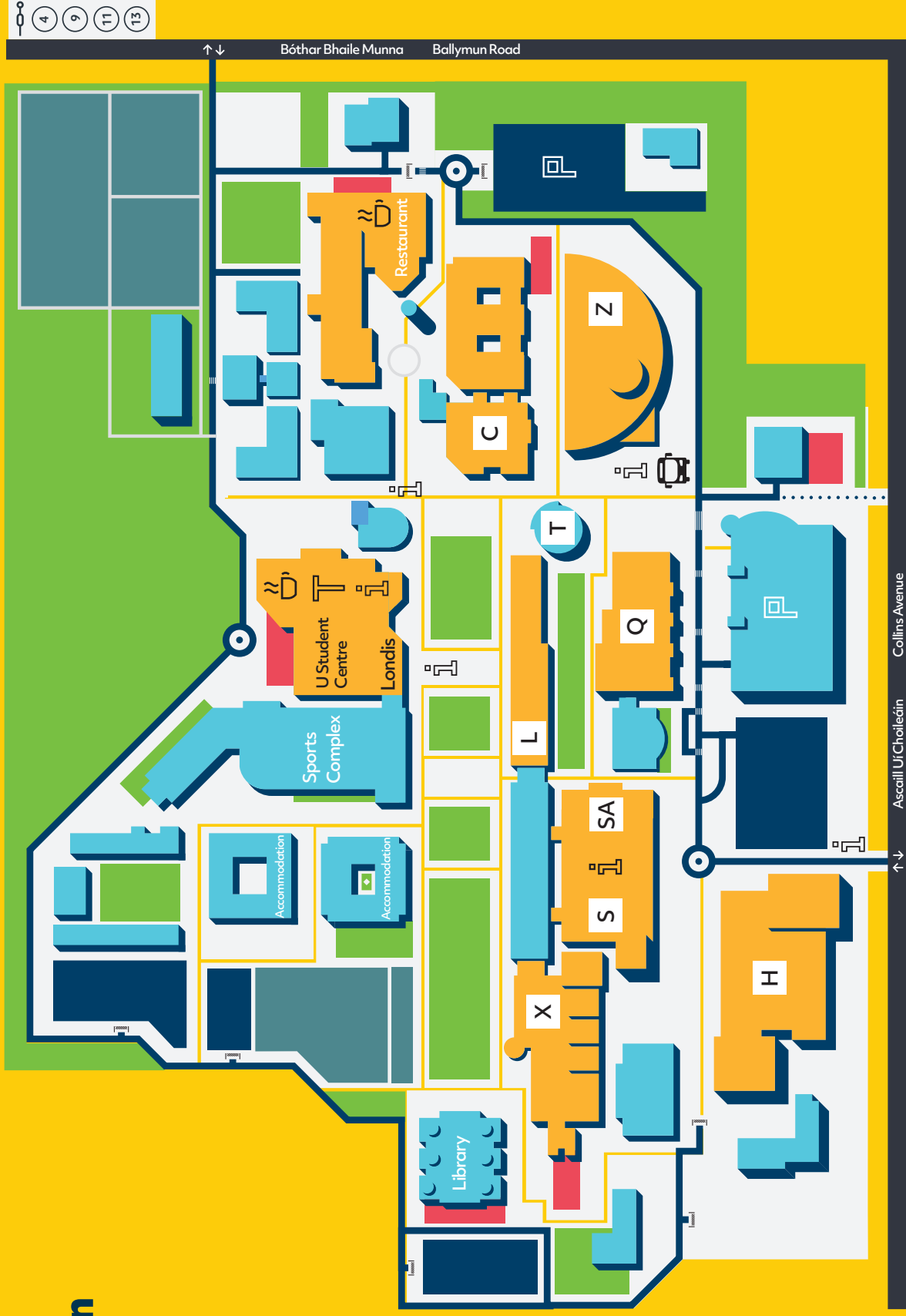

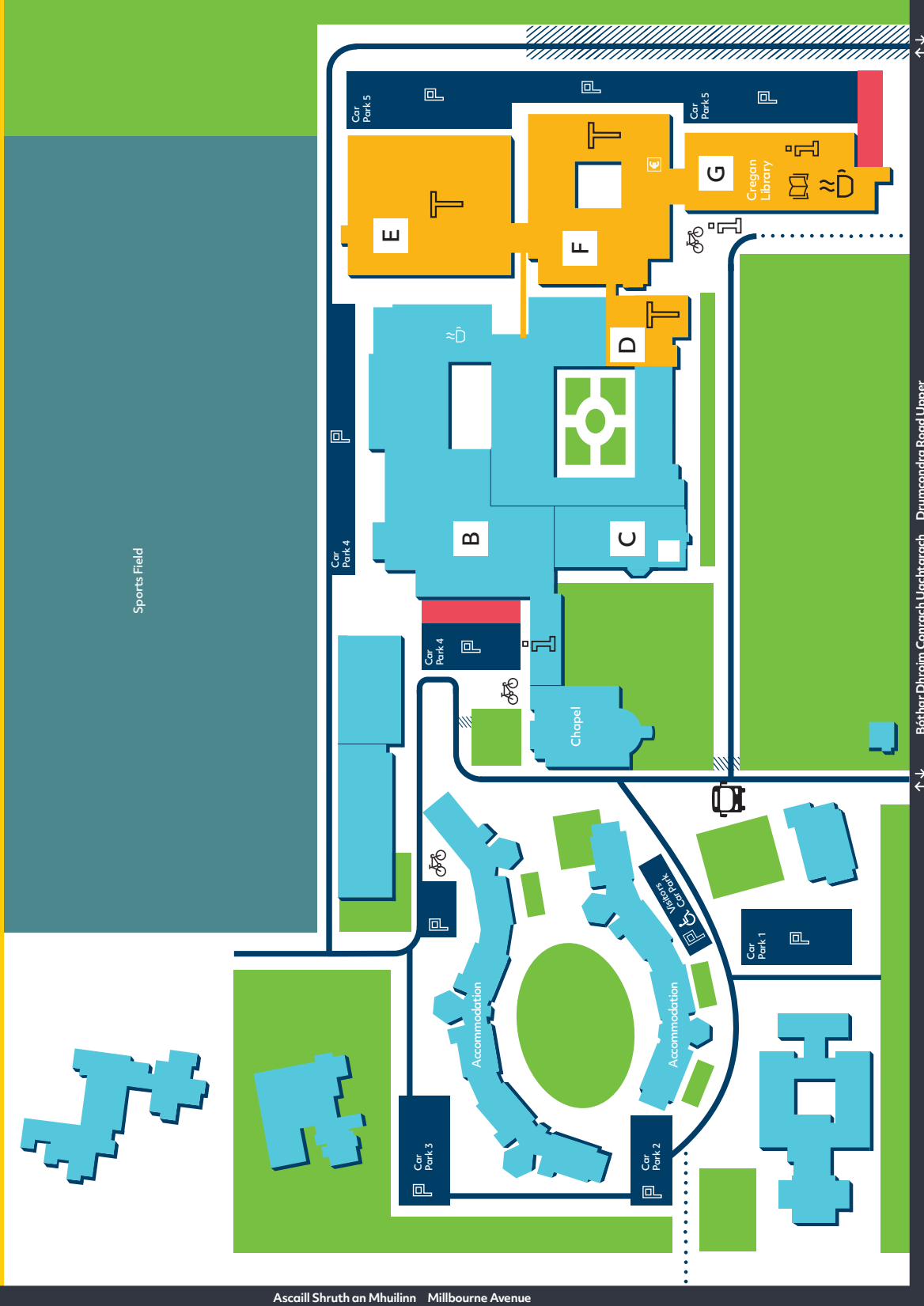
