Definition of Recognition of Prior Learning

MSc in Psychotherapy RPL Process

The MSc in Psychotherapy is at level 9 in the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ; 120 ECTS), comprising of 15 core modules including theoretical, research and professional practice modules. There are entry points into the MSc at Years 1, 2 and 3. Those applying for direct entry to year 1 of the programme are required to have a relevant level 8 degree and a minimum of one year's relevant work experience. Those year 1 applicants who do not fulfil the academic requirements, and those applying for direct entry into year 2 or 3, are required to apply through the RPL process, as follows:

- ➤ The applicant applies to the MSc through the online application portal, noting in their personal statement an intention to apply through RPL to Year 1, 2 or 3 of the MSc, and the grounds for this.
- Two staff members review all online applications to the MSc programme and identify applicants that note an intention to apply through RPL.
- > Suitable applicants are called for interview.
- ➤ Following successful interview, the RPL applicant is emailed by the Chair of the MSc programme and invited to submit their RPL application to the Chair by a designated deadline.
- ➤ RPL applicants are responsible for clearly documenting and evidencing required and relevant learning, qualifications and experience within their RPL application.
- An RPL Board is convened comprising of two members of the MSc in Psychotherapy programme team and the School of Nursing, Psychotherapy and Community Health Postgraduate Convenor. All RPL applications are reviewed and a decision is made by the Board regarding offering a place on the MSc, and at what year of the programme.
- The Chair of the MSc in Psychotherapy notifies Registry and relevant university staff of decisions made by the RPL Board and applicants receive notification from Registry through the online application system.
- ➤ The Chair of the MSc in Psychotherapy is available to offer feedback/advice to RPL applicants.
