

What is Moodle?


Moodle is DCU's Virtual Learning Environment (VLE), an online application that lecturers can use to create effective online learning sites. Features of Moodle include;

- Assignment submission and grading
- Discussion forum
- Online quiz



How to access Moodle

Open your web browser and go to <http://moodle.dcu.ie>. In the login area in the top right of the page, enter your DCU username and password. After you log in, the "My courses" block on the left of the screen will display links to your registered modules.
