Programme Regulations 2015-2016

B.Eng - M.Eng Mechanical & Manufacturing Engineering

1. Programme-specific rules and requirements

The 2nd year precision mark, where there is one, is included in the award classification calculation at a weighting of 10%, [Ref.: DCU M&S 8.1.1]

The 3rd year precision mark is included in the award classification calculation at a weighting of 15%, [Ref.: DCU M&S 8.1.1]

In the case of a student who transferred into the programme in 3rd year, there is no 2nd year contribution, and the 3rd year precision mark is included in the award classification at a weighting of 15%, [Ref.: DCU M&S 8.1.1]

2. Derogations from Marks & Standards

Marks and Standards apply

3. Progression

Generally, students must successfully have completed a minimum of 60 credits in a study period in order to progress to the next study period. Students will not be permitted to 'carry' modules except in exceptional circumstances and subject to the approval of the Progression and Award Board and mode of delivery permitting.

Students who achieve a minimum standard of H2.2 in year 4 (Level 8) have the option to progress to the Level 9 MEng. in Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering.

4. Compensation

Compensation may apply, within the regulations specified in Marks and Standards, to all modules [Ref.: DCU M&S 7.2.8].

Compensation is not permitted for the MEng. In Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering (Level 9) of the programme [Ref.: DCU M&S 7.2.7].
