Programme Regulations 2015-2016

B.Eng. - M.Eng. in Mechatronic Engineering

1. Programme-specific rules and requirements

The 2^{nd} year precision mark is included in the award classification calculation at a weighting of 10%. [Ref.: DCU M&S 8.1.1]

The 3rd year precision mark is included in the award classification calculation at a weighting of 15%. [Ref.: DCU M&S 8.1.1]

In the case of students who transferred into the programme in 3^{rd} year – there is no 2^{nd} year contribution, and the 3^{rd} year precision mark is included in the award classification at a weighting of 15% [Ref.: DCU M&S 8.1.1]

Students will receive a mark for INTRA; however, INTRA has a weighting of zero, and consequently this mark will not contribute to the precision mark for third year [Ref.: DCU M&S 7.1.3].

2. Derogations from Marks & Standards

Marks and Standards apply.

3. Progression

Students will not be permitted to 'carry' modules except in exceptional circumstances and subject to the approval of the Progression and Award Board and mode of delivery permitting.

In order to progress from year 4 (Level 8) to year 5 (Level 9), students must have obtained a minimum standard of a H2.2 classification on their Level 8 award.

4. Compensation

Compensation is permitted for all undergraduate modules as per the rules set down Marks and Standards. [Ref.: DCU M&S 7.2.8].

Compensation is not permitted for the 5th year (Level 9) of the programme [Ref.: DCU M&S 7.2.7].
