BSc in Physical Education with Maths ¹(PEM)

For Entrants Prior to 2013 – Old structure

1. Programme-specific rules and requirements

The $1^{st} - 4^{th}$ year precision marks are included in the award classification calculation at the following weightings [Ref.: DCU M&S 8.1.1]:

Year 1 – 5%

Year 2 – 10%

Year 3 – 35%

Year 4 – 50%

Students who transfer into the programme in 2nd or 3rd year will have their degree classification based on the contribution precision marks that were achieved at DCU as per the weightings outlined above in the relevant years.

An attendance of 80% is mandatory for successful completion of the following modules (School of Health and Human Performance attendance policy):

2. Derogations from Marks & Standards

3. Progression

Students must obtain the minimum number of credits indicated below in the relevant academic session to progress to the next academic session. This has been approved as a derogation.

Year One - 60 credits Year Two - 62.5 credits Year Three - 72.5 credits

4. Compensation

Compensation does not apply to modules MS110, SS113, SS119, SS128, SS123, ES123, ES143, SS222, SS223 ES215, ES228, SS228, SS234, SS321, SS323, ES330, ES336, ES338, ES341, MS220

5. Repeat Students

First Year Repeat Students

Where a student enrolled in Year One of the programme in the academic year 2013/14 is required to repeat Year One in the academic year 2014/15 they will sit (a) the module (s) which they did not pass in the initial academic session if it is still offered on the new structure or (b) a replacement module as indicated below.

SS118 – Students must take SS128 with the credits increased from 5 to 7.5 SS103 – if this module is failed then students can re-take this as it is active on the PEB structure

Second Year Repeat Students

Where a student enrolled in Year Two of the programme in the academic year 2013/14 is required to repeat Year Two in the academic year 2014/15, they will sit (a) the module(s) which they did not pass in the initial academic session if it is still offered on the new structure or (b) a replacement module as indicated below.

ES216 students must take ES228 with an increase of credits from 5 - 10 MS200A – students must take MS200 with a decrease in credits from 7.5 - 5

Third Year Repeat Students

Where a student enrolled in Year Three of the programme in the academic year 2014/15 is required to repeat Year Three in the academic year 2015/16, they will sit (a) the module (s) which they did not pass in the initial academic session if it is still offered on the new structure or (b) a replacement module as indicated below.
