Programme Regulations 2015-2016

Masters in Chronic Disease Management (MCDM)

1. Programme-specific rules and requirements

The MSc in Chronic Disease Management (MCDM) is a 2 year part-time programme requiring the successful completion of 90 credits. Students may exit after 18 months with a Graduate Diploma in Chronic Disease Management and the successful completion of 60 credits. An additional exit point, the Graduate Certificate in Chronic Disease Management, is available to students who wish to exit after the successful achievement of 30 credits. All exit awards must include the core module entitled Chronic Disease; policy and contemporary issues (10 credits).

The precision marks will be calculated on the results of all modules undertaken in the achievement of the 30 credit, 60 credit or 90 credit exit points.

3. Progression

Students must successfully have completed the following credits in each study period to progress to the next study period.

Year 1: 40 Year 2: 50

To register for the dissertation module students must have completed the research methods or have demonstrated evidence of same or similar through RPL procedures. In the event that this has been demonstrated – students must complete the required 20 credits from the other option modules available.

Students can exit with a Graduate Diploma upon successful completion of 60 credits. The 60 credits includes all of the above modules except for the Research Dissertation
