#### 1. Adoption of agenda

The agenda was adopted subject to the deletion of Item 4 and the inclusion of one new submission under Item 10.1, five new submissions under Item 10.2, one new submission under Item 11.1 and one submission under Item 13.

## 2. Minutes of the meeting of 22 March 2007

Confirmed and signed by the Chair.

## 3. Matters arising from the minutes

**3.1** Follow-up actions from the last meeting were reported.

- **3.2** <u>Noted</u> that the issue of the devolution to Faculties of some activities might partially be addressed in the context of the proposed establishment of a Graduate Studies Board (or similar title), but that arrangements still remained to be made in respect of some other activities (those not relating to research students). (Item 3.2)
- **3.3** <u>Noted</u> that proposals in relation to the Academic Framework for Innovation would be the subject of an oral report to the 13 June meeting of Academic Council and a written submission to the 25 June meeting of Council. (Item 3.3)
- **3.4** <u>Agreed</u> to re-establish the working group to discuss issues relating to the delivery and award of programmes by DCU and another institution, or other institutions, with Ms McDermott as chair. (Item 3.5)
- **3.5** <u>Noted</u> that Dr Noel Murphy had carried out extensive consultation in relation to the proposed new report form for external examiners for taught programmes but that, in his new capacity as Head of the School of Electronic Engineering, he would not be in a position to continue this work. <u>Agreed</u> that Ms McDermott would request from him details of the conclusions available to date on the basis of the consultation, and that the work would then be finalised. (Item 3.6)
- **3.6** <u>Noted</u> that a policy statement relating to the decision-making processes used by the Disciplinary Committee would be submitted to a future meeting of Academic Council. (Item 3.7)
- **3.7** <u>Noted</u> that it would be possible to add a note to the Diploma Supplement to indicate that a Master's programme had had a credit rating of 75 and the rating had subsequently been changed to 90. <u>Agreed</u> that Ms McMorrow would consult Faculty Offices about the desirability of doing this. (Item 6)
- **3.8** <u>Noted</u> that Dr Gary Murphy, Director of Graduate Research, had submitted a proposal on graduate studies to Academic Council for its meeting of 13 June. (Item 7)
- **3.9** <u>Noted</u> that one of the proposals made by Dr Murphy (see 3.8 above) was for the establishment of a Graduate Studies Board (or similar title) which would be chaired by Dr Murphy, would meet alternately with the University Standards Committee, and would consider, *inter alia*, the range of issues relating to research students which is currently dealt with by the USC. (Item 7)
- **3.10** <u>Noted</u> that a School which had been requested to identify an alternative potential external examiner to the person originally nominated had done so and that the new nomination was on the agenda of the present meeting. (Items 8.1.2)

- **3.11** <u>Noted</u> that a School which had been requested to confirm the dates of appointment of two nominated external examiners had done so, that one nomination had therefore been deemed approved and that the other was now the subject of discussion within the School, with approval not being sought until the discussion had ended. (Item 8.1.7 and 8.1.8)
- **3.12** <u>Noted</u> that a School which had been requested to clarify the dates of appointment and proposed duties for a nominated external examiner had done so and that the nomination had therefore been deemed approved. (Item 8.1.10)

## 4. Proposal arising from decision on marks bands

Deleted from the agenda.

#### 5. Proposal on revised English language requirements

<u>Approved.</u> Noted that there was concern within the University about the standard of academic English of some overseas students notwithstanding the fact that they had met the general English language requirements. <u>Agreed</u> to request Dr Claire Bohan, Director of Student Affairs, to address a future meeting of the University Standards Committee about this issue. <u>Noted</u> that the International Foundation Programme would in future have a wider remit which would allow scope for offering further support to students in relation to academic English.

## 6. Proposal on revised supplementary admissions procedure for applicants with disabilities

- 6.1 <u>Approved</u> subject the inclusion of flexibility with regard to the composition of the Disability Admissions Committee, particularly as far as the role of the Associate Deans for Teaching and Learning is concerned; <u>noted</u> that it might be helpful to include the staff member responsible for disability in each Faculty rather than the Associate Dean. On behalf of the University Standards Committee, the Chair expressed thanks to Mr Pat Hoey, Disability Officer, for his work on this issue.
- 6.2 <u>Noted</u> that the HEA was to require higher education institutions to gather additional data on non-traditional students, including students with disabilities.

#### 7. Proposal for readmission of a student following a protracted absence

- **7.1** <u>Approved</u> subject to the student being required to complete the degree programme in the shortest possible time. The student will therefore not be allowed to defer any part of the programme, though s/he may still avail of the standard number of repeat examination attempts if necessary.
- 7.2 <u>Noted</u> that Section 29 of *Marks and Standards*, which deals with minimum and maximum times and modes of attendance, does not distinguish between a student who requests a deferral because of illness or some other adverse circumstance and a student who chooses to request a deferral in the absence of any such circumstances.

## 8. Revised nomination form: external examiners for taught programmes

Both the revised nomination form (EE1) and a new supplementary form (EE2) designed to cater for requests for reappointment and changes to duties were <u>approved</u>. Appreciation was expressed to Ms Claudine Devereux of Student Awards in the Registry for her work in relation to this issue.
