1. Adoption of agenda

2. Minutes of the meeting of 12 October 2006

3. Matters arising from the minutes

- **3.1** Follow-up actions from the last meeting were reported.
- **3.2** <u>Noted</u> that a proposal on credit ratings for taught Master's programmes would be submitted to the 6 December 2006 meeting of Academic Council and that the outstanding matter for decision related to programmes which are of less than one calendar year's duration. (Item 3.2)

- **3.3** <u>Noted</u> that the devolution to Faculties of some activities currently undertaken centrally would be discussed by Professor Slowey, the Deputy President as Chair of Budget Committee, the Deans and the Associate Deans. (Item 3.3)
- **3.4** <u>Noted</u> that proposals in relation to Phase II Modularisation would be submitted to Executive at its meeting of 28 November 2006. (Item 3.4)
- **3.5** <u>Noted</u> that legal advice had indicated that the new compensation regulations approved by Academic Council at its meeting of 11 October 2006 should not be implemented until the 2007/08 academic year. <u>Noted</u> that the implementation of recommendations under Phase II Modularisation might have a bearing on the necessity of compensation in a general sense. <u>Agreed</u>, however, that to the extent that compensation would be required in 2007/08 and subsequent years it was the new regulations that should apply, and that it would be very important to ensure that all students and staff were enabled to become familiar with them at the appropriate time. - **3.6** <u>Noted</u> that a working group had been convened to discuss issues relating to the delivery and award of programmes by DCU and another institution, or other institutions. <u>Noted</u> that the discussion would benefit from work currently being finalised by Mr Gordon McConnell which would result in templates for memoranda of understanding and similar documents becoming available. (Item 3.6)
- **3.7** <u>Noted</u> that a revised proposal on the external examiner system would be submitted to the 1 February 2007 meeting of the University Standards Committee (Item 3.7)
- **3.8** <u>Noted</u> that postdoctoral students were sometimes engaged as internal examiners for research students and that this practice had a number of advantages. <u>Agreed</u>, however, that it was important in all cases to put appropriate systems into place to ensure that no disadvantage accrued to any party involved. (Item 3.8)

10. Approach to be taken to a range of issues involving research students

<u>Noted</u> that the ITS system would soon incorporate increased capability with regard to research students and that this would facilitate tracking of modules and other activities that they might undertake. <u>Noted</u> that single modules to be taken by research students could be managed in the same way as stand-alone modules are at present (i.e. go through a standard approval process). <u>Noted</u> that a national approach to issues such as accreditation of such modules for research students, and transfer of research students from one institution to another, was under discussion and that it would be important to have systems in place to meet changing needs. <u>Noted</u> that a DCU working group had been convened to discuss the issues and that it would include Professor Kennedy, the Associate Deans for Research, and some other members.

11. Proposal to change the marks bands for degree classification

This proposal, from the Faculty of Science and Health, was <u>noted</u> with considerable interest. The following was <u>agreed</u>: the Associate Deans for Teaching and Learning would facilitate discussion of the issue across Faculties and with the linked colleges; a proposal on the issue would be made to the 1 February 2007 meeting of the University Standards Committee; Professor Slowey would be requested to raise the matter at a national level through the Irish Universities Association; Ms Maura McGinn, Institutional Analysis Officer, would be requested, for background information purposes, to provide information on the numbers of awards made within each of the current bands. <u>Noted</u> that it would also be important to take account of the views of stakeholders such as the Department of Education and Science (with reference to teacher education).
