9:30 – 11:00: Defining, Detecting, and Dealing with Plagiarism in 2012

This interactive session will cover a range of topics in a joined-up approach to dealing with plagiarism in 2012. The presentation and associated activities cover ways to ensure students know what is expected and to ensure they have necessary skills to avoid plagiarism. We will also explore designing assessments which are hard to find, fake or copy. The session will look at how to spot instances of misuse of others' work and finishes with suggestions for institutional management of cases when they appear. 14:00 - 16:00: Plagiarism and Culturally Diverse Students

(Capacity: 30)

This session looks at issues of plagiarism through the lens of issues relevant to teaching linguistically and culturally diverse students (or what many call international students). Points raised include the impact of students' previous educational experiences and beliefs on writing practices they use in Ireland; how to discourage copying and more importantly, how to ensure that when copying is disallowed, students have alternative authoring strategies; the role of language competence in 'writing in your own words'; and appropriate and fair ways of managing cases when they occur. About Jude

Jude Carroll worked for several decades as an educational developer at Oxford Brookes University in the UK, where she took on a wide range of responsibilities but specialised in managing student plagiarism and in effective teaching of international students. She researches, writes and presents around the world on aspects of managing plagiarism.

She is the author of *The Handbook for Deterring Plagiarism in Higher Education* (2007, 2nd ed) and with Dr Janette Ryan, she co-edited the widely used text *Teaching International Students: improving learning for all* (2005: Routledge). In 2009, Jude was awarded a UK National Teaching Fellowship in recognition of her work in both fields. In 2012, she completed a six month study tour of secondary and tertiary teaching in Australia, New Zealand and India, including visits to IB schools.
