Workshop Overview:

Reflective writing "allows students to record thoughts and insights about their own learning experience. It encourages students to review and consolidate learning, to evaluate performance, to plan future learning based on past learning experience. In such a way, students become capable to take charge of their own learning, and eventually to develop into independent lifelong learners" (from the Teaching and Learning Centre at Hong Kong Polytechnic University). I will discuss strategies for using and assessing reflective writing.

- Recognise what effective reflective writing looks like and how to scaffold that process
- Characterize a good strategy for assessing reflective writing
