- 3.1 It was <u>noted</u> that the updated list of Academic Council members was finalised and posted on the Academic Affairs website (Item 9).

## B. <u>Policy and strategy issues</u>

## 7. **President's report (oral report)**

- 7.1 The President <u>noted</u> that he had met with the recently appointed Minister for Education and Skills, Mr Joe McHugh and the Minister for State, Ms Mary Mitchell O'Connor. The meeting was held in the context of DCU formally taking on the Presidency of the IUA for 2019.
- 7.2 The President <u>noted</u> that the Higher Education Authority Act is currently being updated and will address primarily the differentiation between the HEA's regulatory / oversight role and the strategy and policy responsibilities of the Minister for Education and Skills in relation to the higher education sector.
- 7.3 The President informed Council that DCU is awaiting details from the Department of Education and Skills regarding the gender-specific professionships reported in the recently announced *Accelerating Gender Equality in Irish Higher Education Institutions 2018-2020*.
- 7.4 The President <u>noted</u> that the discussions between DCU and the HEA on the HEA Performance Compact plan have been completed and he anticipated that the agreement will be signed in January 2019, with retrospection to September 2018.
- 7.5 The President <u>noted</u> that the DCU Strategic Plan 2017-2022 Year 1 Implementation Report and Prioritised Plans for Year 2 will be circulated university-wide shortly. He informed Council that he and members of the senior management team would commence meetings with Faculties and Units over the coming weeks. The focus of meetings will be a dialogue on strategy implementation to date and the priority areas of activity for 2018-2019.

- 7.6 The President extended his thanks to all those involved in the Institutional Quality Review in October 2018 and commended the work of Quality Promotion Office in the organisation of the review. He <u>noted</u> the very positive commendations made by the External Review Panel in their exit presentation.
- 7.7 The President extended his thanks to all those involved in the November 2018 graduation and commended Registry in particular for its organisation of the ceremonies. He <u>noted</u> that 3871 students had graduated over ten ceremonies, including 69 doctoral students.
- 7.8 The President informed Council that the Academic Scholarship Awards ceremony would take place on Wednesday 5 December 2018 in the Helix. He indicated that approximately 130 students who achieved 550 CAO points or above in the Leaving Certificate, representing 21 counties and 39 degree programmes would be presented with the Academic Scholarship Award.

# 8. Graduate Outcomes Survey 2018 Presentation, Ms Karen Johnston and Ms Yvonne McLoughlin

The following were noted from the presentation on the Graduate Outcomes Survey 2018.

- Due to the new and longer format of the survey the valid response rate decreased from 57% last year to 45% this year. This was due to the high number of survey questions that were required to be answered before the survey was considered valid.
- 4342 email invitations to complete the survey were sent out with only 14% of those surveyed completing as a response to the e-mail. The remaining survey responses were as a result of direct text and phone communication with the graduates by the Careers Office.
- The level of granularity of the questions and the language used for some of the questions made the survey more problematic than in previous years e.g. 'accredited placement'.
- It was <u>noted</u> that open-ended questions for institutional use were included in the survey and the responses received will be analysed and may be useful in the completion of curriculum reviews.
- It was <u>noted</u> of those who are available for work 97% of DCU graduates are in fulltime employment or further study.
- It was <u>noted</u> that comparative data will be made available by the HEA early next year.
- It is intended to publish the data in some form on the website, to share the data with faculties and programme chairs in a useable format and to analyse the answers to the more open questions thematically.

The President thanked Ms K Johnston and Ms Y McLoughlin for the very useful data presented.
