SECTION A: MINUTES AND RELATED ISSUES

1. Adoption of the agenda

The agenda as circulated was adopted.

2. Minutes of the meeting of 4 April 2019

The minutes were <u>approved</u>, subject to a minor amendment under item eight (adding in the word 'regulations).

3. Matters arising from the minutes of 4 April 2019

- 3.1 It was <u>noted</u> that completion of the operationalisation of the new module type was awaited, as it would affect whether or not the automisation of the listing of the new module type on the programme regulations could be facilitated. (Item 3.1)
- 3.2 It was <u>noted</u> that a sub-group of University Standards Committee and Registry colleagues met with the Professional Master's in Education (Primary) team on two occasions to discuss an alternative way, other than a derogation, of dealing with

students who failed ED8056 and were due to continue on with teaching practice in semester two of year two. A solution was found which mitigated the need for a derogation.

The solution agreed was that the Faculty represented by the Programme Chair and the Associate Dean for Teaching and Learning would make formal submissions on a case-by-case basis to the Vice President for Academic Affairs (Registrar), requesting specific students would not be allowed to progress. It was <u>noted</u> that the details of this procedure were yet to be clarified (Item 5.1.5).

- 3.3 It was <u>noted</u> that work is ongoing in ensuring that the linking to programme regulations on the Loop programme page can be done as efficiently as possible on an annual basis (Item 3.2).
- 3.4 It was <u>noted</u> that work is ongoing on ensuring that the title of the person nominated to approve the nomination of external examiners in place of the Head of School appears appropriately on the EE1 form (Item 4.1).
- 3.5 It was <u>noted</u> that the workload associated with the nomination of the external examiner for item 4.1.6, 4 April 2019 was clarified (Item 4.1.6).
- 3.6 It was <u>noted</u> that the workload associated with the nomination of the external examiner for item 4.19, 4 April 2019 was clarified (Item 4.1.9).
- 3.7 It was <u>noted</u> that the outcome of a request to have the average number of modules appear on the EE1 form for USC information is awaited (Item 4.1.6/4.1.9)
- 3.8 It was <u>noted</u> that an update on Marks and Standards is on the agenda of this meeting (Item 6).
- 3.9 It was <u>noted</u> that an updated version of the Recognition of Prior Learning policy is on the agenda of this meeting (Item 7)

6. Marks and Standards 2019.1

The document Marks and Standards 2019.1 was <u>approved</u> subject to the following changes:

- Deletion of references to level five. (This level was added to Marks and Standards in anticipation of a proposal, currently under discussion. As the item had not been progressed to approval stage, it was agreed that the level five references were not required in Marks and Standards).
- Under 6.3.2 moving '(i) no resit of the continuous assessment is available' from the 'conditions' section to the end of section 6.3.2.
- Amendment to the definition of Progression to 'Progression is defined as the permission granted to a student to register in the subsequent academic session for the next diet of modules within his/her programme'

It was <u>agreed</u> that the revised version reflecting the changes noted above would be submitted for Academic Council approval at its meeting of 17 June 2019.

7. Revised Recognition of Prior Learning Policy

It was noted that some clarification around advanced entry and module exemptions was required (second last paragraph of the policy, page 3). It was agreed that a discussion would take place between the Director of Registry and the Chair of USC with a view to circulating the finalised document to USC in advance of submission to Academic Council for its 17 June 2019 meeting.

8. Programme Regulations 2019-2020

It was agreed to extend the deadline by which Programme Regulations would be deemed approved until Friday 31 May 2019, to enable the completion of the review of regulations.

It was <u>noted</u> that there was an absence in consistency across the University on 'monitoring of attendance' and it was suggested it might be useful to review it to establish a more consistent approach to attendance in the programme regulations. It was noted that there are no regulations at University level with respect to attendance and that attendance is usually a professional requirement.

It was $\underline{\text{noted}}$ that no derogation would be required for Springboard programmes with respect to repeat attempts.

It was $\underline{\text{noted}}$ that each new Springboard programme should have a specific set of regulations.
