Enhancing the quality of clinical education.

### Who should apply:

Applicants must be working in a setting where they are likely to provide care to children with neuromedical/neurosurgical conditions.

#### Module Aim:

This module is designed to increase the theoretical knowledge base of healthcare practitioners who care for children with neuromedical / neurosurgical needs in both acute and community settings. Students will gain a greater understanding of evidence-based neuroscience care including underlying pathophysiology, treatment modailtes and management.

# **Learning Outcomes:**

On completion of this module and following a period of personal study the student will be able to:

- Demonstrate an understanding of normal neuroanatomy and neurophysiology and its application to disordered function.
- Assess, plan, implement and evaluate evidence-based holistic family-centred care of the child with a neuromedical/ neurosurgical condition.
- Discuss the neuromedical /neurosurgical and pharmacological interventions available to support the child with altered neurological function.
- Analyse the psychological, sociocultural and economic implications of altered neurological function on the child and their family.
- —Evaluate the contribution of the multidisciplinary team in the care of children and their families who have neuroscience related needs.

The module, run in association with DCU, will commence in February 2019. It will be delivered in Temple Street Children's University Hospital on the following dates: February  $6^{th}/7^{th}/27^{th}/28^{th}$ , March  $13^{th}/27^{th}$  and April  $17^{th}$  2019.
